KEEP AWAKE...

We are surrounded these days by the commercial 'circus' of Christmas shopping and 'getting ready'. It might seem far removed from the story that we are celebrating; the story of a poor refugee family 2,000 years ago who had a very special delivery; the story of God choosing to intervene in human history in such an intimate and shocking way; God choosing to be born into a situation of poverty and danger. It is good to ask ourselves at this time of year, what are we getting ready for? Advent is a wonderful season which invites us to use our waiting to grow spiritually. We are invited to make space for ourselves and for God in the midst of the rushing. Can we stop and be still and ask ourselves: 'Where do I see God being born around me today?' In those I meet? In kind words and gestures? In my community? In my own heart?

Have a more 'aware' Advent. Be mindful in all you do. Be aware in your rushing, as you stand in that queue, as you eat, be aware of your feelings, of your thoughts. By watching all of this we become more awake, more able to recognise our true selves and more able to see God being born continuously each day within us and around us. Our awe and wonder grows and we can be prepared for the coming of the Gift himself. How we prepare determines what will be.

Safeguarding. As you are most likely aware from media reports, we are living in a culture where children, young adults and vulnerable adults are abused, used for the transportation of drugs etc., trafficked and used as modern slaves. This is happening in our locality.

Liverpool Archdiocese has recently undertaken an event to increase awareness of these issues. Each of us has a role to play in protecting vulnerable people, both in our parish and in the wider community. Please read the flier which is available in the church porch. Information is given about how to recognise the signs of abuse and who to contact if you suspect this is happening. Contact details are available on posters in the church porch.

Our parish Safeguarding Rep is Linda Morris who can be contacted via the parish office.

Mass Books. Today we begin using Mass books for the readings and following the Mass; they are next to the hymn books. I feel it is time we invested in Mass books rather than using leaflets. For one thing it will save us money in the long term, as leaflets are a constant cost compared to buying the books only once, and secondly, just as importantly, the leaflets we use are thrown away once Mass is completed...not very environmentally friendly.

Christmas Cards to the Holy Land. This is the final weekend for writing Christmas cards to the West Bank and Gaza Strip parishes to let them know that they are not forgotten. There is a box in each porch to collect cards, into which you can insert a greeting slip in English and Arabic and add your name and parish. The cards will be sent in one parcel.

We are short of Mass Intentions for both churches at present; would this perhaps be a lovely season to think of having a Mass offered for loved ones or special intentions?
