A popular Sufi tale tells of a man who built a lighthouse in a desert and everyone laughed at him; but when the light rotated and lit up the desert all around it like a carousel, everyone was amazed....except the lighthouse builder. However, there are desert places in all our lives which need transforming by light so that we see how God wants us to live.

Jesus said "I am the Light of the World; anyone who follows me will have the light of life."

The truth is that all of us are invited to be part of the Jesus' lighthouse project to bring light into the world and make the desert spring to life. He calls us to a new scale of values whereby we define success not by the letters after our name or the security of our bank balance, but by becoming the person that God created us to be...which is the image of Jesus.

This has got to be our hope; that the world is not beyond redemption. Jesus calls us to be people of faith, people with a vision, people who are prepared to build lighthouses in the desert from where his light can give a new vision of what humanity is meant to be.
