This Vocations / Good Shepherd Sunday presents us with a two-fold challenge and invitation as the people of God. Pope Francis has a vision of an authentic Church meeting the needs of the world, especially the young, where people preach and witness to truth. As part of the family of God, we all need to exemplify the values of our faith, because in a recent exchange with young people who were in discernment for the priesthood and religious life it was discovered that most of them had only felt able to take the first step after the encouragement of friends and fellow parishioners. We are all called to foster and raise up such men and women with the capacity to be good shepherds, not only now but anticipating the needs of our Church into the future. We need their vision and joy, their faith and hope, as they walk with God who challenges them to see the movement of the Spirit in our world.

We pray that they will encounter God calling them beyond their greatest expectations, and that their hearts will be on fire through the celebration of their faith, the sharing of hope, and their living out the example of Jesus Christ.

This year Liverpool Archdiocese will have one ordination to the Priesthood and one ordination to the Diaconate; we also have six other seminarians and one student who will begin his formation in September. Please pray for all of them.
