They say a problem shared is a problem halved. 'Don't worry' is one of the most reassuring things that a friend can say. Isn't it a relief when someone assures us there is no need to fret or worry, that everything will be all right? If only for a moment, we can breathe a sigh of relief and take the pressure off ourselves. Even if things are messy now, we dare to hope that all will be well.

The words of Jesus in today's Gospel are very reassuring...

'Do not let your hearts be troubled or afraid...

My own peace I give you.'

Jesus was speaking these words to his disciples shortly before his Passion and death. He knew the time was coming for him to leave them. All was certainly not well, and his disciples surely knew that some difficult times were ahead. But Jesus was offering hope and consolation: "Don't worry, he says. I am giving you the gift of peace, a peace the world cannot give. Don't be afraid. The Holy Spirit will be with you to guide you and teach you." When our hearts are troubled and restless, let us reach for these words of Jesus.

Synod 2020...Our Parish Meeting

Over the past few weeks you will have seen references in the newsletter to Synod 2020, encouraging you all to have your say via the online survey Synod2020.co.uk.



As an Archdiocese we are now moving forward with this process and our Synod Parish members, Martyn Griffiths (St Lewis) and David Torevell (All Saints), will soon be hosting a joint 'listening and discerning' session. This will involve a small group activity and will be held after evening Mass on Wednesday 19th June at All Saints Church.

We encourage you to come along and have your say about the future of the Church, as you see it. To gauge attendance there will be a sign-up sheet at each church on the noticeboard. This will allow us to set out the room and organise refreshments. If you have any questions David and Martyn will be only too happy to answer them.

Whilst I shall be present at the start of the meeting to introduce it, I shall not be staying. It has been suggested that my presence might inhibit people speaking freely. Since this is the purpose of the meeting, I am only too happy to absent myself and grant you this opportunity. Fr. Gordon

The 4 Synod Questions that will inform and inspire our project of listening are:

- *Where in your everyday life do you experience love, truth, goodness hope and joy?
- *When you reflect on your life now and as you look to the future, what causes you concern and worry?
- *What is the purpose of the Catholic Church in the world today?
- *Having reflected on these things, what are the topics you would like to see on the agenda of Synod 2020?

Towards Synod 2020, a time to pray and listen. There is an open meeting on Tuesday 28th May at 7.00 pm at St Charles Church, 224 Aigburth Rd, Liverpool L17 9PG, followed by refreshments in the parish hall. The speaker is Monsignor Peter Fleetwood, formerly an Official at the Pontifical Council for Culture; his talk is entitled "The Church as leaven in our cult."
