We usually associate Jesus more with peace than division; the birth of Jesus was greeted with the angels singing 'Glory to God in the highest heaven, and peace to men who enjoy his favour' and the first words He speaks to His disciples after the resurrection are 'Peace be with you' but today it is all about division. Surely Jesus didn't really want to split families up!



At the time that Luke was writing the Gospel, the early Christian community was experiencing division... households were indeed divided over whether to believe in this new Good News... so it is not that Jesus is in favour of division rather that not everyone was ready to accept his teachings and to acknowledge him.

Powerful words are used; 'I have come to bring fire to the earth, and how I wish it were blazing already!' Words which remind us that he wants the flame of faith to burn strong and to spread across the earth... Perhaps He would say the same today... how I wish they were blazing today... how I wish you were so on fire with the Good News that the flame would pass on to those you meet. It is a call to us all to pass on the flame of faith... the flame may burn bright... or burn out... or the embers kept gently glowing for future reference... all we can do is try and pass it on.

A Fresh Start for our Pastoral Area.

Here are the new arrangements for how the priests and deacons of our pastoral area will organise their ministry in the new situation that faces us from 1st September and the new Mass Schedule which will begin at the same time. The creation in 2011 of the two large parishes in Leigh, served jointly by four priests, was intended as a step towards them becoming one parish at some time in the future but the addition last year of Croft, Lowton, Golborne and Hindley Green to the pastoral area and the removal this summer of one priest means that a different arrangement is now needed. After much consultation, prayer and reflection, a final meeting this week of priests, deacons and lay people with representatives of the Archdiocese has agreed a new way forward.

The pastoral area will be divided into four units of roughly equal size, each having its own parish priest and a deacon serving two churches, three schools and three or four former parish communities:

The existing parishes of St Catherine and All Saints, Golborne and St Lewis, Croft served by Fr Gordon Abbs and Deacon Derek Morris.

The existing parish of St Edmund Arrowsmith served by Fr Kieran O'Grady and Deacon Dennis Vint.

The part of the existing parish of St Margaret Clitherow (keeping that name) which comprises the former communities of Holy Family, Boothstown, St Gabriel's, Higher Fold and St Ambrose Barlow, Astley, served by Fr Paul Grady and Deacon Bob Hewertson.

A new parish is proposed to be created combining Sacred Heart, Hindley Green with the former communities of St Richard, Atherton and Sacred Heart, Hindsford (currently part of St Margaret Clitherow parish), served by Fr Paul Seddon and Deacon Ken Holding. There will be a consultation about the name of this proposed new parish.

The priests and deacons are committed to working together to support each other in serving the whole pastoral area. The priests will meet monthly and will be joined by the deacons at alternate meetings.

To continue to build up the collaboration in ministry which is needed to enliven and develop our communities, three new consultative structures will be created: a Parish Council in each unit, a Pastoral Area Council which will meet termly and an annual Open Meeting for the whole pastoral area. The new Mass Schedule which will begin on the weekend of 31st August/1st September has been designed to provide three weekend Masses for each of the four units and to reduce the need for supply priests when one of the priests is away, allowing time for priests to get from one church to another when covering for each other. There will be a reduced schedule for the summer holidays next year and the whole schedule will be reviewed before next September.
