Be honest – are there times when you approach Mass with a niggling feeling that something is not quite right? Perhaps you've fallen out with someone or been less than fair in your dealings with a friend or colleague. Then there are times when we happily go along to Sunday Mass without so much as a thought to how we have lived that week. Jesus has some strong words for us all in today's Gospel. We must first reconcile with our brothers and sisters and even be on good terms with our opponents before we approach the altar. Simply put, how can we be in communion with God if we are not in communion with our neighbours? If we believe that all that is expected of us is to go to Mass on Sunday and 'follow the rules', we have missed something important along the way. Jesus does not want us merely to follow the letter of the law. There is more to living out our Christian life than obeying the rules. Someone commented that Pope Francis 'seems to have read the book'. His actions are speaking just as loudly as his words, and even his words are challenging us to look at how we live and how we treat others. The Gospels are not a rule book but a blueprint for a radical way of life.

Pastoral letters

This weekend we have not one but two Pastoral letters. The first is from Archbishop John as a prelude to our celebration of Lent. The second is from Mgr Phillip Inch, Episcopal Vicar for Evangelisation who heads up the Pastoral Development Strategy. He is inviting our Deanery of Wigan and Leigh to engage in the Pastoral Strategy that came directly out of the findings of the Synod. With two Pastoral letters to listen to I ask for your patience and engagement particularly with regard to the latter as we enter an important phase in our church's journey.

Offertory Collection Envelopes

It's getting to that time of year again when we have to order the Offertory Envelopes for the new tax year. If you have envelopes each year and want to continue to use them, you don't have to do anything; we will order new ones for you.

- ◆ You are gift aiding and no longer paying tax or you're a tax payer & would like to start to gift aid.

Gift Aid

If you pay tax and you Gift Aid your offerings this means that the government will pay the parish an additional 25% on top of your donation.

Card Reader

As you know we now take card payments at both our churches for anyone wishing to buy books, cards, statues or make a donation, including offertory donation.

Anyone who currently makes a weekly offertory donation by cash (not envelope) now has the option to do this electronically. However, please note we are unable to claim Gift Aid on these donations.
