**Order of Mass P6, The Nicene Creed P11**



Today we celebrate Trinity Sunday. We hear in the Gospel today that some of those gathered doubted even in the presence of the Risen Lord. We may be shocked that the disciples could doubt, even in Jesus's presence.

But it should also console us; doubt helps us ask questions and helps our faith to grow.

It is healthy, it is sometimes necessary; it reminds us of the mystery of God. Those who claim they know for certain, surely have no room for growth, and we know that the disciples learned and grew and faced many challenges along the way. It was a very human journey, and so it is for us. Jesus offers us the assurance that he is with us always, even when doubt clouds our vision. We do not emerge the other side unchanged. Doubt can sometimes help us in our faith; it keeps our mind open, our hearts searching and can bring us to a new point if we allow it.

'Each one of you has to be God's microphone. Each one of you has to be a messenger, a prophet... Where is your baptism? You are baptised in your professions, in the fields of workers, in the market. Wherever there is someone who has been baptised, that is where the Church is. There is a prophet there. Let us not hide the talent that God gave us on the day of our baptism and let us truly live the beauty and responsibility of being a prophetic people.'

**Care for Creation**

Last weekend we added an insert to the newsletter in which we gave a summary of Pope Francis Laudate Deum along with an update of what we have achieved as a Care for Creation group, our plans for the future and where you can help. We have recently been looking into those items that we can't recycle at home, and have signed up with a company called TerraCycle who will recycle those items. There is a bin at All Saints near the table on the right as you come into the porch for collection of such items. We have put a note on the top of the bin to say what is and isn't accepted. There is also a leaflet available for you to take home so you know what to bring. ***Initially will run this as a pilot scheme at All Saints.***

**Family of Parishes**

**St. Edmund Arrowsmith (SEA)  
 St. Catherine & All Saints SCAS and St. Lewis (SL)**

It was announced in the Pastoral Letter of March 2024, that Parishes across the diocese have been organised into Families to address the issues that we are beginning to face, particularly the shortage of priests. We'd like to update you on what's happening within our Family.

**Progress**

A Family of Parishes Council (FoPC) has been formed comprising of: Fr. Gordon Abbs, Fr. Kieran O'Grady, Mel Humphrey and Linda Morris (SCAS), Caroline Owen (SL) and Danielle Coburn, Pauline Aspden and Tommy Gaughan (SEA).

SCAS and SL already have a Parish Council. One is in the process of being formed at SEA. The intention is that each Parish Council's agenda will be used to inform the agenda for the joint FoPC. Each Parish will also have its own Finance Council to ensure that Parish Finances remain separate as is required under Canon Law.

One of the first things members need to do is familiarise themselves with all the properties across our Family. So, we will be visiting each church site with the intention of determining how they can be best used to fulfil our Church's mission. This may lead to some properties being rented or sold and the monies being released to employ Pastoral Assistants or Catechists to assist in the work of the Parishes.

To facilitate change, joint social events will be planned to help parishioners get to know each other and the priests will be celebrating mass in each other's churches, the first occasion being week ending 8<sup>th</sup>/9<sup>th</sup> June.

The Families of Parish Council would welcome any ideas you may have. If you are concerned about any matter, please speak to any of the FoPC members or ring either Parish Office.
