It is with a sense of deep sadness with thanksgiving to God for a life lived in the Lord's service, that we have learned of the death of our Holy Father Pope Francis.

## Feast of St. Catherine of Siena: 29th April 2022

St. Catherine of Siena was born during the outbreak of the plague in Siena, Italy on March 25, 1347. She was the 25th child born to her mother, although half of her brothers and sisters did not survive childhood. Catherine herself was a twin, but her sister did not survive infancy. Her mother was 40 when she was born.

She became a lay member of the Dominican Order and fellow Dominican sisters taught St. Catherine how to read. She was a mystic, activist and author who had a great influence on Italian literature and on the Catholic Church. She was Canonised in 1461, she is also a Doctor of the Church and one of the most influential and popular saints.
