Today's Gospel presents Bartimaeus *the blind man*. Everything conspired to tell him he was useless: he couldn't work (and there was no Social Services); he couldn't support himself and he couldn't support a family – if he had one. He missed most of what was going on. He was a nuisance – *begging*, perhaps an insistent beggar.

Had he ever got to Jerusalem, he would have been barred from the temple.

Why was he blind? Had he sinned? probably most of those who knew him thought he had. Did he have friends? He lived on the margins, hardly even a half-life. When he called out to Jesus, people quickly told him to shut up: But he didn't shut up. He shouted more loudly. Unlike the rich man of a few weeks ago, the one who walked away sad, the blind man did not ask: *What must I do to inherit eternal life?* He pleaded only, *Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me*. Jesus simply asked him: *What do you want me to do for you?* He got him to articulate his desire; and then went on to say: *Your faith has saved you, your faith has provided the basis for your sight.*

He was the symbol of the enlightened disciple who, once enabled to see, **“followed Jesus along the way”**. He had already lived his own Calvary - so for him the way led to new and unimaginable life. Sight is just one of the many gifts that God has given to us. Like all of our basic senses and talents, sight is a gift we often take for granted. When we congratulate ourselves for our accomplishments do we forget that whatever we do, we do with the gifts that God has given to us?
