Order of Mass P6, The Nicene Creed P11

Springtime is a time for growing in the faith, and it is good to check whether Jesus' teaching is taking root in our hearts. Today's readings focus on being steadfast in faith. St. Paul encourages us to "be steadfast, immovable... knowing that our labour is not in vain." We need to be like this, if we are in any way to lead others towards Jesus, and help

them to grow spiritually, just as we are hoping to grow ourselves. But however firm we may be in the faith, we are warned against letting a judgmental attitude to root in us. Jesus put this warning in a dramatic symbol:

Don't try to remove the splinter from another's eye, until you have removed the plank from your own eye! We must not self-righteously correct others without honestly evaluating ourselves.

In Springtime, deepening of faith and dedication should lead to a spiritual maturity, when we aim to be mutually supportive. This warning against hasty judgment and arrogance is sandwiched between Christ's teaching about universal love and his call to build our life on the solid foundation of his word. He calls us to be "merciful, as your Father is merciful," and "like the Most High who is kind even to the ungrateful" Our life in the Spirit results from his gift and our cooperation. Our part is to remove obstacles to growth, and one of our positive goals is to develop a kindly attitude to our fellow Christians. It is for us to help them and leave it to God to judge them.

Offertory Collection Envelopes

- ◆ You don't have envelopes and would like to start using them or would like your offertory to be made by Standing Order.
- ◆ You have envelopes and you no longer want to use them.
- ◆ You are gift aiding and no longer paying tax or you're a tax payer & would like to start to gift aid.

Gift Aid: If you pay tax and you Gift Aid your offerings this means that the government will pay the parish an additional 20% on top of your donation.
