### *Sanctuary Flower Arrangements Easter 2024*

As climate crisis and social injustice become more urgent, we are all encouraged to look at our own lifestyles and see how they impact on these issues. We are asked (not least by Pope Francis) to make lifestyle changes which will help mitigate the problems.

The flower arrangements on the sanctuary represent some changes you may wish to adopt.

### *St. Catherine:*

Plant wildflowers to encourage bees and butterflies and improve biodiversity.

### *Our Lady:*

Use low energy lighting to cut down on fossil fuel use.

### *The Blessed Sacrament:*

Avoid the use of single-use plastic.

### *Sacred Heart:*

Re-use / recycle clothing and school uniforms.

### *Lectern:*

Have more meat-free meals.

### *Cross:*

Walk more or use public transport to reduce fossil fuel consumption.

### *Reredos:*

Care for the poor and vulnerable by buying Fairtrade products.

All the flowers are artificial to avoid the unacceptable carbon footprint associated with imported fresh flowers. The fresh flowers and plants in the Easter Garden have been grown in the parish grounds by the Care for Creation team, sourced locally or are from parishioner's gardens / homes

This year the window displays have been provided by St. Catherine's Primary School, Lowton Junior and Infant School and Heath Street Methodist's 'Messy Church', Asylum Seekers sponsored by Heath Street Methodist and Golborne High School.
