In the film Jesus of Montreal (1988), a group of actors stage a passion play and gained praise for their gritty, stripped down re-telling of the Jesus story. While their play casts doubt on the divinity of Jesus, their lives outside the drama begin to imitate his story. The lead actor, Daniel, is heralded by one of his fellow actors and gathers a group of actors around him. A cynical lawyer tempts him with fame and fortune in a skyscraper 'wilderness.' Like Jesus, Daniel eats with those who have dirty hands.

Mark's authorities miss the point of their 'human' traditions. Jesus offers a more radical way of thinking, which ultimately leads to his trial, death and glorification. For the Pharisees, Jesus is an impious lawbreaker. But Mark reminds his readers that the authorities have mistaken their own customs for God's law.

The movie finds an apt allegory for this in Daniel's motley crew of actors. While some might find the replacing of Christianity with theatre disturbing, the parable, like all parables, reveals a truth. The Gospel plays with our boundaries. Those with dirty hands seem outside but it is the expected insiders who are ultimately rejected. Both stories end unresolved, to be continued in the lives of those who eat without washing.

World Day of Prayer for the 'Care of Creation'

During the last eighteen months, many of us have been aghast at those who remain sceptical about the Covid-19 pandemic and see it as some sort of conspiracy. Sadly, there are plenty of people who view the constant warnings about climate change in a similar way. However, the evidence is undisputable, and the latest report from the UN warns us that if we don't take action now, the damage to the earth, our common home, will be irreversible. Just this month we have heard about terrible fires in Europe and the United States, as well as unprecedented flooding in various cities. In 2015, Pope Francis issued an encyclical letter—*Laudato Si – Care for our Common Home* - and established a *Season of Creation* in the Church's Year to help us to focus on the cry of the earth. The season begins on 1 September with the *World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation* and runs until the 4th October which is the feast of St Francis of Assisi the Patron Saint of ecology. All Christians are asked to pray on this day for our environment, in particular for the devastating effects of climate change and its effects on the poorer nations.

Refugee Project

Ten sacks of garments and blankets went off to the Asylum Centre in Wigan on Thursday. This batch has brought your total to 637 new garments, 52 knitted blankets and 12 sacks of good-as-new items for small children. Thank you and well done to everyone involved. The report from the Centre is that refugees are now arriving in a desperate state with fewer belongings than ever before, so your support is greatly needed. The next collection will be in late September or early October. Any new knitters would be very welcome, as would any donations of wool. Thank you.

All Saints Food Bank: A pause in your generosity?

For the next few weeks could you take a rest from donating food for the foodbank here at All Saints? It may on the face of things appear to be a strange request, but allow me to explain. It is eight weeks since we have taken over from ACT Foodbank, providing help for those in need in the Golborne and Lowton area. As we thought, it has been a slow beginning whilst people got to know where we are and what help we can provide. So, that's why we got the Mayor to come and see us three weeks ago to provide a little publicity. As we know the furlough will lapse in the not too distant future and so will the £20 rise in Universal Credit. Undoubtedly, we will then see a rise in people accessing our services. At present we have a good deal of stock in hand. Now, none of us want food to go to waste and even the food that you donate has a 'use by' date on it. So, if you wouldn't mind for the moment simply pausing your donations until we get a rise in the take up and then we will have a better picture of how we can meet people's needs at this time.
